Turning My Life Around

I'm 21 and before I got involved with FCA I was living in a filthy, cluttered apartment with my mom who is an alcoholic and a hoarder. Things got worse when I met someone who I loved but who turned out to be bad for me and I ended up involved with the law and now have a criminal record. I suffered mistreatment from my mom, abandonment from my dad and fell victim to a con artist, but slowly I've begun to turn things around. Thanks to help from my transition coach and caring donors, I've been able to take driving lessons, obtain a driver's license, and find employment. I have two jobs and have been able to save \$4,000 so that I can have a place of my own someday. I was on the wrong road, but now am confident that I'm on the path to a bright future.

A Little Help Means Everything

I was living alone in my house without heat or hot water because I got swindled by a company who called and said they were home heating specialists. I was having a hard time managing my finances and was unable to manage my clutter but was too proud to ask for help, even from my adult children. After several conversations with an FCA case manager, I agreed to accept help. With her assistance I received funds to repair my heat and hot water issues, reapplied for food stamps, obtained financial counseling and have been placed on a waiting list for an emergency response system.

HELPING HANDS



Employees of MSC Industrial Direct (pictured right) actively engage in helping their neighbors by funding important projects and providing the elbow grease to get things done. They conducted a Valentine's Day program to buy gifts for homebound seniors and then delivered the gifts to many towns across the island spreading hope to isolated seniors.



They also planted and spruced up the front garden of our Veterans' Residence creating curb appeal for this special home. After their gardening was completed, they shared a meal and stories with residents providing much needed companionship.



MEETING THE NEEDS OF OUR COMMUNITY



EDUCATION & LIFE SKILLS

Various reports estimate that the number of at-risk youth who are homeless in Nassau County approximates 1500-2000, with many of them involved in the juvenile justice system or unable to finish high school. To help these young people move beyond their challenges to become self-supporting adults, we developed Step Up to Success (SU2S); it is both a concept (Theory of Change) and a set of procedures (protocol) that has the potential to transform youth service delivery in Nassau County. We recruited 18 young people at risk of homelessness or challenged by other barriers to be part of our 100-day pilot project. These participants included a diverse mix of young people with some who were ageing out of foster care, teen parents at risk of homelessness and others without a family caregiver or a place to live.

These young people presented with a wide range of challenges and varying degrees of readiness for independent living – in addition to histories of physical and/or emotional trauma. **Early results from our pilot project (see chart on previous page) indicate that the Long Island community will see a reduction in the costs associated with youth homelessness, unemployment and juvenile crime; *but most importantly*, young people will transition into successful adults who have the capacity and the confidence to lead productive lives.** Plans are underway to expand this project to include 50 at-risk youth and seek to confirm these early positive indicators.

RESULTS OF 100-DAY PILOT PROJECT



HOME VISITATION, OVERSIGHT & INFORMATION

By the year 2050, the world's seniors (over the age of 60) will outnumber children under the age of 15 for the first time in history. This historic shift is impacting Nassau County, where the senior population is projected to increase at a more rapid rate than the senior population in the state as a whole (see chart on page 10). In 2013, we improved the lives of over 9000 senior citizens through personalized care, access to available resources and application assistance for entitlements. We reached seniors who live at home, in skilled care facilities and adult homes as well as presented information on health insurance and Medicaid at community centers and libraries.

Facts & Figures

According to a recent New York State Department of Health report, approximately 380 seniors currently living in nursing homes on Long Island could be living independently, saving taxpayers \$8.7 million. With ongoing support and regular contact with FCA, seniors can and do remain in their own homes, connected to their community. The majority of our clients have been with us for many years, with 50% receiving services for over 3 years and 35% for more than 5 years; our oldest client is 104 years of age and still living at home!

PREVENTION, COUNSELING & SUPPORT

In addition to socioeconomic challenges, many of our clients are among the estimated 9.2 million adults with co-occurring mental health and addiction disorders, or are part of the 70% of youth in juvenile justice systems that have at least one mental health condition (Mental Illness Facts and Numbers, National Alliance on Mental Illness). Therefore, every effort is made to offer housing, one-on-one counseling, support groups,

home visits and respite to youth, adults and families dealing with addiction, PTSD, trauma and mental illness.

Both our Hempstead Chemical Dependency Treatment Center and Hicksville Counseling Center offer outpatient substance abuse treatment and prevention programs; Home & Community-Based Services, Family Center, Lakeview House and West Nassau Residence are devoted to helping youth and adults with a diagnoses of mental illness, in some cases providing respite or shelter ; and Family Ties, Family Support and Vocational Education provide support and skill building tools to enable struggling adults a pathway toward a better life for themselves and their children. For those new parents who are struggling financially or are recent immigrants, our Nursery Co-op offers free childcare for their toddlers while parents work on strengthening their English language skills, job readiness skills or other life-improvement plan. Another opportunity for advancement is available through our Vocational Education program. Affiliated with our substance abuse program in Hempstead, it is open to adults many of whom have struggled with substance abuse issues in the past, yet have found a path to recovery and wish to earn a high school equivalency diploma and beyond.

Our efforts to advocate for mental health and support services for veterans continued in 2013 through support groups, housing, participation in Nassau County Stand Downs for Veterans, membership in the Veteran's Health Alliance of LI and an open house celebrating Veteran's Day at which we disseminated information and honored Nassau County Veterans Treatment Court Judge Anna Anzalone.

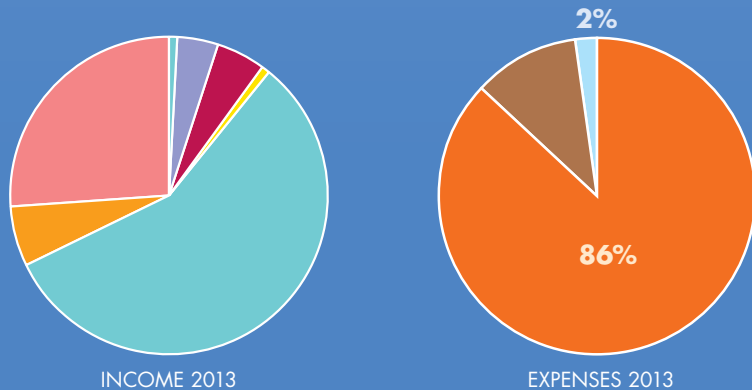
